Revelation 11:11-19

The Witnesses Resurrected

- ¶ 11 Now after the three-and-a-half days the breath of life from God entered them, and they stood on their feet, and great fear fell on those who saw them.
- 12 And ^[e]they heard a loud voice from heaven saying to them, “Come up here.” And they ascended to heaven in a cloud, and their enemies saw them.
- 13 In the same hour there was a great earthquake, and a tenth of the city fell. In the earthquake seven thousand people were killed, and the rest were afraid and gave glory to the God of heaven.
- ¶ 14 The second woe is past. Behold, the third woe is coming quickly.

Seventh Trumpet: The Kingdom Proclaimed

- ¶ 15 Then the seventh angel sounded: And there were loud voices in heaven, saying, “The ^[f]kingdoms of this world have become the kingdoms of our Lord and of His Christ, and He shall reign forever and ever!”
- 16 And the twenty-four elders who sat before God on their thrones fell on their faces and worshiped God,
- ¶ 17 saying:
“We give You thanks, O Lord God Almighty,
The One who is and who was ^[g]and who is to come,
Because You have taken Your great power and reigned.
- ¶ 18 The nations were angry, and Your ^[h]wrath has come,
And the time of the dead, that they should be judged,
And that You should reward Your servants the prophets and the saints,
And those who fear Your name, small and great,
And should destroy those who destroy the earth.”
- ¶ 19 Then the temple of God was opened in heaven, and the ark of ^[i]His covenant was seen in His temple. And there were lightnings, noises, thunderings, an earthquake, and great hail.

Note:

NU-Text

These variations from the traditional text generally represent the Alexandrian or Egyptian type of text [the oldest, but sometimes questioned text]. They are found in the Critical Text published in the Twenty-sixth edition of the Nestle-Aland Greek New Testament (N) and in the United Bible Society's third edition (U), hence the acronym "NU-text."

M-Text

This symbol indicates points of variation in the Majority Text from the traditional text [a consensus of most Greek manuscripts]. It should be noted that M stands for whatever reading is printed in the published Greek New Testament According to the Majority Text, whether supported by overwhelming, strong, or only a divided majority textual tradition.

Revelation 11:11 “the breath of life from God”

“Breath” The word breath in Greek is “pneuma” and is used 385 times in the New Testament. It is most often translated as “spirit”, as in the Holy Spirit.

Luke 1:35 And the angel answered and said to her, “The Holy Spirit will come upon you, and the power of the Highest will overshadow you; therefore, also, that Holy One who is to be born will be called the Son of God.

Luke 3:16 John answered, saying to all, “I indeed baptize you with water; but One mightier than I is coming, whose sandal strap I am not worthy to loose. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire.

Matthew 28:19 Go therefore and make disciples of all the nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit,

Revelation 11:11 “life from God” Life” The word life in Greek is “Zoe” it means, life, both of physical (present) and of spiritual (particularly future) existence, i.e. it always (only) comes from and is sustained by God's self-existent life. The Lord intimately shares His gift of life with people, creating each in His image which gives all the capacity to know His eternal life. life real and genuine, a life active and vigorous, devoted to God, blessed, in the portion even in this world of those who put their trust in Christ, but after the resurrection to be consummated by new accessions (among them a more perfect body), and to last for ever.

Matthew 19:23-26 — (With God All Things Are Possible)

23 Then Jesus said to His disciples, “Assuredly, I say to you that it is hard for a rich man to enter the kingdom of heaven.

24 And again I say to you, it is easier for a camel to go through the eye of a needle than for a rich man to enter the kingdom of God.”

25 When His disciples heard it, they were greatly astonished, saying, “Who then can be saved?”
